The proposal for HPRB 5560S must be completed by mid-point of the semester preceding the field experience. Field experience proposal materials will be made available after advisement for the internship.

HPRB students are required to compile and maintain an E-portfolio documenting and exhibiting work or experiences gained throughout the undergraduate program.

### **Double Dawg Students:**

If you are pursing a Double Dawg program with an undergraduate degree in public health and the Master of Public Health degree, the following courses are typically the graduate level courses you should consider.
