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**Major Requirement:** If you completed the PHYS sequence in Area VI, you must show proficiency in Anatomy (CBIO 2200, CBIO 3000, or CBIO 3010) and Physiology (CBIO 2210, PMCY 3000, VPHY 3000, or VPHY 3000E). Upper level courses can count as your major elective science options.

Please note that pre-requisites apply for many courses. Several required courses have pre-requisites and must be taken in sequence. Additionally, many of the science classes have pre-requisites. Please see your advisor for proper course sequencing.

Study abroad courses may work as major electives. Talk to your advisor.

First Aid and CPR certification is required **prior to registration** for HPRB 5560S or HPRB 3480S.

The proposal for HPRB 5560S must be completed by mid-point of the semester preceding the field experience. Field experience proposal materials will be made available after advisement for the internship.

HPRB students are required to compile and maintain an E-portfolio documenting and exhibiting work or experiences gained throughout the undergraduate program.

#### **Double Dawg Students:**
