**Major Requirement:** If you completed the PHYS sequence in Area VI, you must show proficiency in <u>Anatomy</u> (CBIO 2200, CBIO 3000, or CBIO 3010) and <u>Physiology</u> (CBIO 2210, PMCY 3000, VPHY 3000, or VPHY 3000E). Upper level courses can count as your major elective science options.

Please note that pre-requisites apply for many courses. Several required courses have pre-requisites and must be taken in sequence. Additionally, many of the science classes have pre-requisites. Please see your advisor for proper course sequencing.

Study abroad courses may work as major electives. Talk to your advisor.

First Aid and CPR certification is required **prior to registration** for HPRB 5560S or HPRB 3480S.

The proposal for HPRB 5560S must be completed by mid-point of the semester preceding the field experience. Field experience proposal materials will be made available after advisement for the internship.

HPRB students are required to compile and maintain an E-portfolio documenting and exhibiting work or experiences gained throughout the undergraduate program.
